


Team Structure



Project Goal

The purpose of this project is to facilitate adoption of geographic information systems (GIS) and related processes to enhance elections management and citizen engagement across the United States. NSGIC will develop and promote best practices for replacing the current street file precinct assignment tables with a more, precise, accurate, and accessible GIS-based process to better manage elections.





43 of 51 State Offices Responded

GIS responses in area of interest

 Voting precinct boundaries, municipal boundaries, school districts, local districts (sewer, water, fire, etc.), and address points

Questions asked focused on stewardship (which state agency) and positioning (status)
